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

INTRODUCTION

IMPACT MANAGEMENT & MEASUREMENT CAPABILITY SUPPORT



HIEx requested assistance from Relativ Impact to facilitate an introduction to Impact Management and Measurement (IMM) for two of their cohort initiatives, WiNFUND and FFA. This collaboration aimed to drive progress towards a more equitable, profitable, and sustainable ecosystem by identifying the appropriate measures, intended results and evidencing the progress and influence of access to healthcare in the relevant societies and economies.

Relativ Impact is an **impact solutions provider that supports purpose-driven organizations on their journeys to achieve significance**. A key aspect of their approach involves enabling teams through participation and practice, to develop implementation and management plans that can be embedded into their organizational culture, embedded through tried and tested tools and training.

This report provides a summary of the support provided by Relativ Impact, the process that was followed and the immediate outcomes of that work in supporting the impact journeys of selected participants across the WiNFUND and FFA cohorts, located across Africa and Indonesia respectively.

OVERVIEW

The Health Innovation Exchange (HIEx) is a multi-layered international platform that supports innovation ecosystems for climate resilience and improved access to healthcare. They work with innovators, investors, and policymakers to bring innovative solutions to life. HIEx operates on three pillars: Convening, Ecosystem Building, and Investment Acceleration. Through think tanks and networking events, they foster multi-sectoral dialogues, enhancing understanding of innovation's impact on healthcare accessibility and driving progressive policies and investments.

HIEx serves as a catalyst, connecting innovators with funding and expertise to bridge gaps in healthcare accessibility and quality, thereby improving global well-being. By connecting startups, investors, governments, and academia, HIEx not only builds robust healthcare ecosystems but also contributes towards sustainable growth and improved access to healthcare. Relativ's support included assisting two of HIEx's cohort initiatives, Women in Innovation Fund (WiNFUND) and Fight For Access (FFA):

WiNFUND, launched in 2022, focuses on empowering women entrepreneurs through fair and inclusive financial support, with a specific focus on Africa.

FFA aims to power change for a healthier Indonesia. Their mission is to propel women-led startups as drivers of transformation in healthcare.



THE CHALLENGE

HIEx requested assistance and support to introduce Impact Management and Measurement (IMM) to WiNFUND and FFA as part of their accelerator programmes. The support was provided through an IMM masterclass, followed by one-on-one coaching sessions with the individual participants to help them further understand and develop the IMM tools for their organisations. This collaboration aimed to drive progress towards a more equitable, profitable, and sustainable ecosystem, evidencing the progress and influence of access to healthcare in society and the economy.

WHAT WE DELIVERED

- > Impact Management and Measurement masterclass
- > One-on-one coaching sessions and email support for each of the participants
- > Development of a Stakeholder Map, Theory of Change, and Impact Measurement Framework
- > Impact Report



RESULTS

The participants who attended the masterclass and the one-on-one coaching sessions successfully developed a Stakeholder Map, Theory of Change, and Impact Measurement Framework for each of the organisations. These participants also observed an overall increase in understanding of the IMM tools, an increase in confidence in developing these IMM tools, and an increase in implementation of the IMM tools for their organisations. Prior to the intervention, the participants did not have an Impact Measurement Framework or formalised Stakeholder Map, and for those that did have a Theory of Change, the support enabled them to refine it further. The Impact Report showcased the changes within the participants' understanding, confidence, and implementation ability of the IMM tools at baseline (before the IMM masterclass), at midline (after the IMM masterclass), and at endline (after completing three one-on-one coaching sessions).



IMPACT

The initial impact assessment data, captured at the close of the accelerator in Africa and Indonesia, provides a snapshot of the impact created through Relativ Impact's support and participants' engagement. Notable benefits include increased awareness, confidence, and recognition of the value of Impact Management and Measurement, as evidenced by participant testimonials. To ensure a comprehensive understanding, ongoing monitoring and mentoring of committed cohort members is recommended at 6- and 12-months post-programme.
